You can download individual articles from the Elsevier journals that are not included in our library's subscription package.


After pre-registration, follow the procedures below to use the Pay-Per-View prepaid service.



## Procedure to use the Pay-Per-View prepaid service

	<p><b>1. Sign in</b></p> <p>Access the ScienceDirect website (<a href="https://www.sciencedirect.com/">https://www.sciencedirect.com/</a>) and click "Sign in." Log in with the registered username (email address) and password.</p>
	<p><b><u>The subsequent procedures differ depending on where you access from.</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ If you are accessing from the internal network of the university<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>2. Change Organization</b></li><li>→ <b>3. Search for articles</b></li></ul></li><li>■ If you are accessing from outside of the university<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>3. Search for articles</b></li></ul></li></ul> <p>*You need not to take step 2.</p>

## 2. Change Organization

Click the square icon at the top right of the window, and your personal menu will appear.

Then click "Change Organization" at the bottom of the menu.



Select "Osaka University, Prepaid" and click "Change Organization" to use the Pay-Per-View prepaid service.

\*If you select "Osaka University, Library," you will be regarded as a general user to purchase articles with your credit card.


