## Chancellor to propose tax credits for the low paid

Gordon Brown will today announce the first phase in the government's promised overhaul of the welfare state with a proposal to pay tax credits to low-paid workers.

Intended to create a new work ethic in the UK, it will feature in today's Green Budget or pre-budget statement by the chancellor, in which he will set out the framework for economic policy over the lifetime of the parliament.

The so-called earned income tax credit would be paid to employees through the tax system and would therefore appear to be "earned" through employment. This is in contrast to Family Credit, currently paid to low-paid workers, which is administered by the benefits agency.

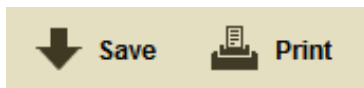
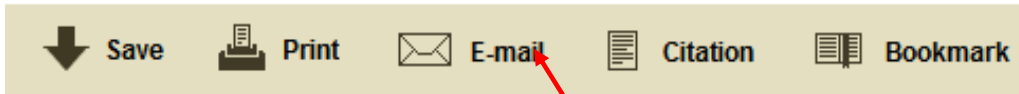

The Tokyo stock market registered a sharp initial fall today as financial authorities in Japan and other leading industrial countries prepared together to counteract any instability in world markets arising from the closure yesterday of Yamaichi Securities, the fourth largest Japanese broker.

At the end of the morning session, after Japan's markets had reopened following a holiday, the Nikkei average was down 4.23 per cent, or 706.99 points, at 16,014.39. This followed falls yesterday in London and New York and cautious reaction in other financial markets to Yamaichi's closure - Japan's biggest corporate failure.

Before trading resumed the Bank of Japan said it was ready "to take the necessary supportive steps, including the provision of sufficient liquidity into the markets, to cope with the risk of an unexpected decline in market liquidity".

The 100-year-old Yamaichi Securities yesterday confirmed it was closing because of a liquidity squeeze. Shohai

Nozawa, its president, said through tears: "This is heart-breaking." The shutdown fuelled fears among international investors that recent turmoil in south-east Asia might be spreading to the world's second-largest economy.

Officials were also preparing to offer loans to Japanese institutions if they encountered problems in raising funds because of a broader collapse of confidence. This would be conducted under article 20 of the bank's constitution, which allows it to provide loans in exchange for collateral.

Ryutaro Hashimoto, Japanese prime minister, on his way to a meeting in Vancouver of the Asia Pacific Economic Co-operation (Apec) forum which was set to be dominated by the Asian turmoil, said: "I would like to make it clear that Japan's problems are completely separate from those of the so-called Asian currency crisis."

The Apec leaders' hopes of restoring stability were undermined by divisions on the scale of the region's problems. Jean Chretien, Canadian prime minister, said many Asian economies would benefit from the recent sharp depreciation in their currencies. But Leekpai, Thai prime minister, said the problems in many Asian economies were serious. A draft of the Apec summit communiqué urges rapid implementation of last week's Manila agreement for tackling financial crises.

A panel of leading Pacific Rim business men urged Apec leaders to respond to the financial crisis by developing and enforcing rules to curb currency speculation. Sir Gordon Wu, chairman of Hopewell Holdings of Hong Kong and a member of the panel, said rules were needed against "concerted or abusive efforts to raise or lower the value of a currency".
